Every Child Succeeds: *a voluntary home-visitation program for at-risk mothers in Clermont and Hamilton counties. Beech Acres Family Support Workers (FSW) begin working with the families prior to the child's birth and partner with the family up to the age of 3. The program offers parenting and child development information and assists in strengthening parenting skills. The FSW also connects the mother and family to community resources as needed.*

Group, Education & Mediation Services: *a variety of services and supports to parents, families and schools to meet the needs of children, teenagers, families, single parents, stepfamilies, and others. Community-based throughout the Greater Cincinnati area.*

- ***Parent Groups and Presentations:*** *a network of specialized groups that provide information, support, and resources for moms and dads experiencing the joys and challenges of raising children, including single parents, stepfamilies, parents of teens, divorcing parents, and any parents wanting to strengthen their parenting skills*
 - ***Parent and Family Consultation:*** *face-to-face practical problem solving with a parenting expert for any family*
 - ***Mediation Services:*** *helps families learn to resolve disputes between parents and teens; divorcing parents and stepfamilies*
 - ***Helping Children Cope with Divorce:*** *collaboration with Hamilton and Clermont Counties' Domestic Relations Court to give divorcing parents the tools they need to help their children work through divorce in the family*
 - ***Services for Schools:*** *tailored to meet the need of students and teachers. Programs on reshaping youth priorities, social skills, conflict resolution, anger management, self-esteem, communication, coping skills, and other related topics*
- Therapeutic Foster Care:*** *Therapeutic foster homes and support services for children*



and adolescents in out-of-home care or who are residing with a relative.

School & Community-Based Services: a continuum of care for school-aged children and their families. Services are provided to meet the child's emotional, behavioral, and educational needs while building the competencies of parents and schools.

- Child & Family Therapy: counseling services for families and children with various treatment or family needs. A range of modalities that include mediation, education, support, and coaching are available for the family or individual
- Therapeutic Mentoring: provides therapeutic mentors who teach/coach or aid children and teens to developmental needs or problems
- Community Support Program: provides individualized client services to support emotionally disturbed children and their families in the community, school, and home settings. Services include advocacy, skill building, crisis support, mental health monitoring, linkage and referral to services and community resources.

Parent Coaching: Coaches assist parents in clarifying their parenting goals, provide ongoing support, and identify parenting strengths and successes, as well as the parenting pattern that may be barriers to success to build parenting capability. Equally important, coaches serve as a "listening ear and a sound board", providing empathy and a sense of connectedness in the midst of the complex job of parenting.

Represent people not able to afford a lawyer in criminal and other cases for which they could lose their liberty (i.e., be incarcerated). These cases include felonies, misdemeanors, and juvenile cases. In order to be eligible for representation by a public defender, the person must be indigent – that is, without assets or income sufficient to afford a lawyer as determined by current guidelines. Public defenders do not represent on civil cases, such as lawsuits, divorces, custody, child support modifications, employment disputes, bankruptcies or anything else for which you cannot be incarcerated.

A history of prenatal, neonatal, and early developmental events that may have affected the central nervous system place many children at a higher than normal risk of developmental delays – these children are also eligible for DD Early Intervention services.

The focus of FCF is the multi-need, multi-system child, meaning a child who is involved with two or more systems (i.e. Children's Services, Developmental Disabilities, Juvenile Court, Early Intervention, mental health services, substance use services) a parent or agency may refer a child to FCF's Wraparound Program. Wraparound is a team meeting process in which the team collaboratively works to determine each child's and family's individual strengths and needs, determine how to access services for those needs, and set goals with the family. The process is family-driven, youth guided, and culturally and linguistically competent.
